Circle Activities:

- Play "I Spy A Friend", using descriptive words to describe a friend
- Discuss and make a chart How To Be A Friend
- Recite, then role play "Two Little Friends" fingerplay.
- Introduce simple American Sign Language: learn to say "Hello Friend" and "I Love You"
- Recite, then role play "Jack and Jill" Nursery Rhyme

Math/Science/Literacy:

- Back to School Math Counters with patterning cards
- Magnetic Shapes and Magnetic Boards using shapes to make designs
- Number locks and keys (use 1 10)
- Observing, sorting, comparing and contrasting rocks and sea shells.
- Make class book What Do You Like to Do With Your Friend?
- Making <u>Friendship Smoothies</u> Everyone in class will work together and take a turn to help add an ingredient to the blender for our smoothie.

Art Activities:

- Friendship painting On a long piece of paper, friends paint together.
- Shades of color in small groups, children work together to mix paints and create new shades of red, blue and yellow paint. Then friends share the new colors and paint.
- **Fingerpainting** with 2 colors to create a third.
- A Circle of Friends painting children paint hands, then work together to cover a large circle shape paper with hand prints.
- Cut, color and glue table
- Tearing paper art tear and glue pieces of origami paper.
- Buddy car painting two friends dip a car in paint and roll back and forth to each other.
- Monthly Self Portrait
- Beading bracelets with a friend
- Shaving Cream and Watercolor-Place shaving cream on paper with a few drops of liquid watercolor, mix together and watch what colors appear.

Other Activities:

- Felt Board Stories:
 Shapetown
 Little Mouse in the House
- Who's Shoe? each child takes one shoe
 off and places in center of circle. One at
 a time, pick up a she, find the friend who
 it belongs to.
- **Do Not Topple the Tower!** Each child in the circle adds a block to the tower
- Hand Hugs- Join hands in a circle, pass a gently squeeze hand hug to the person next to you, and so on
- Friendship Boats- Children pair up and sit across from each other and join hands, then sing "Row, Row, Row Your Boat" together while leaning and rowing
- **Tapping Names-** Take turns hitting the drum to the syllables in our names
